Discussion of Town storm water issues

At length discussion concerning the Main Street ‘trash rack’ and maintenance of Kettle Brook stream between Walgreens and Windsor Locks Congregational Church. Christopher Kervick has requested an investigation into the overflow of water after significant storms. There is no wetlands violation because there is no mention of an extended maintenance conditions in the original Walgreens approval. Walgreens has been cooperating with the Town when asked to cleanout the trash rack.

Mr. Crochetiere, Mr. Malo, and Town Engineer Dana Steele have recommended to Walgreens property management that dredging of two sediment peninsulas in the streambed would alleviate debris and sedimentation conditions in the trash rack. Windsor Locks Congregational Church and Walgreens have not come to an agreement regarding the Church’s parking lot repair/redesign.

Discussion of ongoing maintenance projects:

Dibble Hollow sink holes

- Shored up embankments—work done without permits—notice received post facto
- Long term issue with Jogs pipping issues

78 Briarcliff Drive

- Underground pipes under road appear to be the cause of inundation at residential property
- DPW will scope pipes

21 Cortland Drive

- Silt sack and E&S functioning
- No need to use rip rap at headwall—concrete wing-wall serves same purpose

Ahlstrom pump station

- Contractor started upland work early—notification and work repaired
- Almost ready for exterior work

Chapman Chase

- Still some issues; Dana Steele gave developer a list to improve upon

Main Street Flooding

- Whitecaps were reported on Main Street with the last flood

New Sports Complex

- Change of Zone/Use presently in Zoning
- Plans and application for IWWC are forthcoming
